## MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Tena koutou, Talofa lava,

The weeks are certainly racing by this term. We have had another busy and productive fortnight of teaching and learning.

In the past two weeks I have really enjoyed observing many of our students living and demonstrating our school values of Manaakitanga, Respect, Perseverance, Honesty and Achievement. I would like to take this opportunity to acknowledge the work of our senior student Manaaki Leaders, and thank them. Many of these students participated in a two-day leadership training course, led and developed by Mr Phillip Kauika (Deputy Principal) at the start of the year. Maibiz is an opportunity for students to work in a team and come up with an entrepreneurial idea and then present it to a panel of judges who are successful business people from within our community.

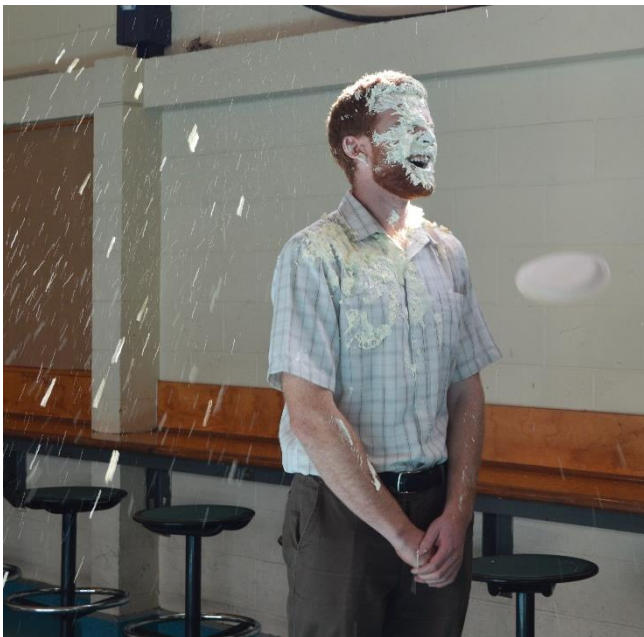
All Year 12 students will be participating and there are credits available for them to achieve. Our focus is not on the credits but on the extra life skills which students gain from participating in Maibiz.
